The Humane Society's 1996 "It's Magic" Calendar!

Top communication professionals from Atlanta, Georgia, judging entries for the 1996 Matrix communications competition, awarded a Matrix crystal to an Austin team representing the Humane Society•SPCA of Austin, Texas.

The 1996 Humane Society's "It's Magic" desk calendar won the valued Matrix award for Brochures, Non-Profit in the annual competition, sponsored by the Dallas Professional Chapter of Women In Communications, Inc. (WICI). The Matrix Award is considered one of the most distinguished communications competitions in Dallas.

Conceived as a gift to charity auction attendees as well as a promotional brochure for the Humane Society, a volunteer committee, headed by Elizabeth Young, Westlake Branch Manager for First American Title Insurance Company of Texas, produced this first desk calendar for the Humane Society.


The look and content of the calendar were determined by the production team of writer Emily Sopensky, photographer Darlyn Davison, and designer Laura Bailie. The theme was determined by the Gala Committee, chaired by Janet Roberts.

Besides having a full year's appointment calendar and providing helpful tips about animal care, it is illustrated with bewitching photographs of Humane Society donors and their favorite pets. The calendar is designed to help pet owners have all information about their pets at their fingertips, such as emergency numbers and dates of veterinary visits. Humane Society staff have already used the calendar extensively in raising funds and promoting its mission of sheltering and placing animals into caring, responsible environments.

Nationally, WICI membership is comprised of nearly 8,500 women and men in all communication fields including print and broadcast journalism, public relations, marketing, advertising, business and association communications, magazine and book publishing, technical writing, communications and law, photography, film, and design.

The 1997 desk calendar is already being developed by the same production team. The committee is chaired this year by Patti Kubala, owner of Animalia Pet Care. Invited guests, representing dominant forces prevalent in Austin, and their pets who have already consented to be photographed for the 1997 calendar are: Governor and Laura Bush, UT Coach Clift Gustafson, local musician Joe Ely, and Kerry Tate, President of the Austin Chamber of Commerce.

Darlyn Davison specializes in photographing owners and their pets.
